BUILDING HEALTHY SMILES INITIATIVE



Building Healthy Smiles recently organized an oral health assessment event at Mar Vista Elementary School in Oxnard on March 29, 2017. Working in partnership with the Ocean View School District and Clinicas del Camino Real, we provided oral health assessments and fluoride varnish to over 100 children at the school. Clinicas will follow up with the parents of children whose teeth were found to have some decay to encourage them to get treatment. Children at the school participated in an oral health presentation conducted by Clinicas Health Education staff and children who saw the dentist received an oral health kit with a toothbrush, toothpaste and floss. A follow-up oral health assessment day is being planned at Mar Vista to see the remaining children at the school who could not visit the dentist due to time constraints. National Volunteer Week is an opportunity to recognize and thank volunteers who lend their time, talent, voice, and support to causes they care about in their

community. Service Unites, the theme for National Volunteer Week, captures the power of change makers to come together to build stronger, more vibrant communities through service. For the past 12 years, Ventura County volunteers have come together in support of the *Earn It! Keep It! Save It!* Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program assisting low/moderate income earners by preparing state and federal tax returns free of charge and helping them access the tax credits to which they are eligible.

Dina Ontiveras of Oxnard has been a volunteer with *Earn It! Keep It! Save It!* since its inception in 2005. Dina stated, "When I find out how much people pay for having taxes prepared, I am motivated to continue providing volunteer services to those who cannot afford to pay for tax preparation. Life is expensive in Ventura County and the return of tax dollars helps ease the cost of living here for the working class."

Natascha Perez, also of Oxnard, has accounting, bookkeeping and real estate experience. This was her first time volunteering with VITA. She shared, "I am excited to be a part of the team, volunteering has offered me a whole range of skills that I can apply to my future plans. Giving time to support causes you are passionate about can help you learn about yourself. Set your goal and come forward. it is never too late to contribute or learn new skills."

Camarillo resident and retired Senior Deputy District Attorney, Pam Grossman has been a VITA volunteer for the past 5 years. "I am currently a volunteer with several different programs but I especially enjoy the training and opportunity offered by United Way through the VITA program," she reflected. "Learning keeps me motivated and working with people keeps me inspired. Each day volunteering with VITA has been incredibly satisfying whether it's sharing information or learning with other volunteers or the gratitude and appreciation that each person you assist shows to you."

This year Moorpark College offered VITA as an internship program for school credit. Shannon Johnson, Work Experience Coordinator at the college, reflects about the value of the program, "The partnership between Moorpark College and the VITA program has provided students with academically and personally rewarding experiences. Students were able to become IRS-certified tax preparers, while working one-on-one with a diverse client base. Students have been able to reinforce their classroom learning with hands-on, real world work and they realized they can engage in career development in socially meaningful ways." Moorpark College intern student Michael Burr shared, "My VITA experience has been wonderful. The people are always appreciative to have their tax return completed. I am getting a great deal of satisfaction by participating and it has been a great learning experience. I plan to volunteer again next year."

VITA volunteers participate in training and/or self study, complete certification testing, and give a minimum of four hours per week during the tax season. So to our more

than seventy skilled VITA volunteers, and to all Ventura County volunteers, thank you for giving back to help make ours a strong and vibrant community.
