### **EDUCATION**

# Goal: Increase the number of students who are college and career ready.

- 1,100 kids received backpacks full of new school supplies through United Way's "Stuff the Bus" campaign.
- 200+ students benefited from the United Way Young Leader Society's Book Bonanza literacy program.
- 7 AVID middle school programs received grants to enhance student performance in Math and Algebra.

# Goal: Help individuals and families become financially stable and independent.

• In 2015, there were 2,132 tax returns prepared through VITA, the Volunteer Assistance Program – infusing over \$2.8M in tax refunds into our local economy.

### **HEALTH**

# Goal: Increase the number of children, young people and adults who have access to preventative health care and are educated about healthy behavior.

- United Way's partnership with the national FamilyWize Prescription Drug Discount Program helped to save the local Ventura County residents \$220,000 in prescription drug costs.
- Over 2,000 pregnant women and parents of young children participated in the Brush Well,
   Drink Well, Eat Well, Stay Well educational curriculum to improve oral health awareness and home practices.

### **Programs and Initiatives**



Good dental health is critical to children's ability to grow up healthy and ready to learn so they can succeed in school and in life. United Way and its partners: Ventura County Public Health, First 5 Ventura County, Santa Barbara/Ventura Counties Dental Care Foundation, Child Development Resources and the Ventura County Office of Education are addressing oral health care gaps in services and access to care barriers for Ventura County children.




An annual campaign to provide new backpacks stuffed with donated school supplies to children from low income families.



Over 20,000 Ventura County callers are connected each year with information about services available to them, including: counseling, food assistance, domestic violence services, employment resources, health care, senior services, legal assistance, substance abuse services, resources for parents and much more.



Earn it! Keep it! Save it! Is a community partnership led by United Way of Ventura County, the Business and Employment Services Department of the Ventura County Human Services Agency, Cabrillo Economic Development Corporation, and the IRS to increase awareness of an access to EITC and to provide electronic filing of income taxes free of charge through the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program.



The Young Leaders Society meets once a month to plan, organize and make progress on addressing issues that impact the lives of Ventura County young people.

A public engagement campaign to help parents, caregivers and communities create early learning opportunities for young children. In partnership with First 5 Ventura County, Born Learning trails have been installed in the communities of Simi Valley, Thousand Oaks, El Rio, Ventura and Santa Paula.

### **Facts:**

- In California, students
  miss 874,000 days of
  school due to dental problems, resulting in \$30
  million dollar loss in
  attendance based funding.
- By kindergarten, over
   50% of children in Southern California have experienced dental decay.
- In Ventura County, only 38% of children covered by Medi-Cal visited a dentist last year.
- In 2015-16, there were over 300 ER visits by children to Ventura County hospitals for oral health problems.



Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites prepare and e-file federal and state income tax returns for low/moderate income earners at no charge.


VITA sites are open from February 4 through April 15, 2017 and are located in:

### What volunteer opportunities are available?

Tax preparation volunteer and Intake/Screening volunteer

### Do I need to be an experienced tax preparer to participate?

No, training will be provided for Tax Prep volunteers on tax law and how to electronically prepare and file the necessary federal and state tax forms using TaxSlayer software.

Intake/Screening volunteers will receive training on how to assist the tax filer to complete the intake form and how to review their paperwork to ensure they have everything necessary to complete their tax return. Bilingual English/Spanish Intake/Screening volunteers are especially needed.

Both opportunities are a great way to expand your resume and help your community!

### Who will I be helping?

You will be helping families  $\overline{\&}$  individuals with earnings below \$54,000 file their return and claim the tax credits they're entitled to for the 2016 tax year. The most valuable tax credit is the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), which can be worth as much as \$6,242 to families with three or more children. Many low/moderate-income earners are also eligible for the Child and Dependent Care Credit, the Child Tax Credit, Education Credit, and CalEITC.

### What kind of commitment is required?

Volunteers are asked to give 4 hours per week during the tax season, February 4th through April 15th. Training (approximately 16 hours) will be offered for Tax Prep volunteers December 3rd and 10th with online sessions also available. Training for Intake/Screening volunteers (approximately 4 hours) will be provided in January.

### **Opportunities**

### Day of Caring (Annual)

This county-wide volunteer event is held once a year, in various cities across Ventura County. Through the United Way Day of Caring event, individuals, students, families and corporate teams complete a meaningful volunteer project that allows them to see first hand how their time and financial support impact local communities.

#### Stuff the Bus (Annual)

This is a 3 hour - one day volunteer event. Volunteers are needed to sort donated school supplies for United Way's annual Stuff the Bus campaign. Stuff the Bus is a community effort to send children from low income families back to school with a backpack full of supplies.

#### VITA: Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (Annual)

Volunteers are needed to assist low and moderate income families (under \$52,000) prepare and e-file tax returns. Training and materials will be provided. Training will be in October with VITA sites opening in late January/ early April.

### Oral Health Project Kit (Year Round)

The Oral Health Project will allow your team to work together all in one location. Team members will pack oral health youth kits. Project materials will include children's toothbrushes, dental floss, children's flossers, timers and tooth paste. — United Way representatives will be on site to manage all project details. A budget is required for this project due to the supplies needed.

### Books Bonanza (Year Round)

Books Bonanza is a monthly reading club where community volunteers read aloud to children and advocate the value of reading. Change a child's story. In as little as 3 hours a month, you can make a difference.
